Account status for APRIL 2018 as of this writing (prior to reconciliation):

- \$ 11,104.28 => Checking balance (higher than one year ago).
- \$ 2,925.00 => Net Gig income over the past rolling year (\$1,025 below prior 12 months)
- \$ 2,200.00 => Membership Dues income over the past rolling year (\$250 above prior 12 months)
- \$ 8,416.15 => Total expenses over the past twelve months (\$2,501.31 above prior 12 months)
- \$ 2,763.05 => Operating surplus for the past twelve months (\$259.91 better than prior 12 months)

Based on the past rolling year's experience, we have sufficient funds on hand to cover about 15 months of expenses.

Membership Status: In April we had two new member households, three renewals, no reinstatements, and no dropped members. Total memberships stand at 86, vs 79 one year ago.

Membership Dues: Annual individual and family membership dues are \$25/year. The immediate family, living at the same address, of an individual member may be included in a family membership. If your membership is due or past due, please send a check to CIFM&MDS, P.O. Box 1503, Indianapolis, IN 46206-1503, or catch the treasurer at the monthly meeting.

Songbooks: Songbooks will be available in electronic format on flash drives for \$10 each. A few copies of the printed "Fiddlers Edition" of fiddle tunes are available for \$5 each. See the treasurer at the meeting if you want to purchase any of these songbooks.
